It is seldem realised how necessary a sheep dog is to the shepherd or the sheep farmer in his daily calling. On farms where there are few sheep he may be and eften is kept because he is such a delightful companion, but wherever sheep and cattle are kept to any extent, then a sheep dog is a necessary factor.

That being so, it behaves us to have the best kind obtainable, and to rear, feed, train and "run", or operate, them in their special function, as well as we possibly can.

Personally I have long been convinced that sheep dog trials have performed an inestimable service in these respects, since they have stimulated such an amount of interest in, created greater care and regard for, the noble collie, and in every way have raised the standard of treatment and handling.

Only those who have best known and leved their collies can realise how remarkably they repay the care and affection lavished upon them. Have you ever thought how, almost alone of God's creatures, they always show their leve and devotion, often in face of much ignorant and even cruel treatment, and how grateful they are for our slightest appreciation and regard? They never forget us, their devotion is lifelong, and they only live to leve and serve.
